

### Dear Parents. Families and Students,

As the end of February draws near and Autumn approaches, I want to let you know that I am both pleased and reassured by the strong start that has been made to the college's teaching and learning program. I am impressed by the way in which our students are coming to classes 'ready to learn', and teachers are continuing to encourage and extend students so that they can achieve their best. Student enrolments have increased and continue to rise. I have been pleased to be able to visit classrooms and spend time around the grounds, and this has given me the opportunity to interact with

students, as well as support and affirm teachers in their work with students. I congratulate all students and teachers for the great start that they have made to the 2017 school year. On Thursday 16 February, I was pleased to be able to welcome our new students and their families to the college at our Year 7 Family Our College Captains for 2017, Miranda Killick and Nureddin barbeque. 
